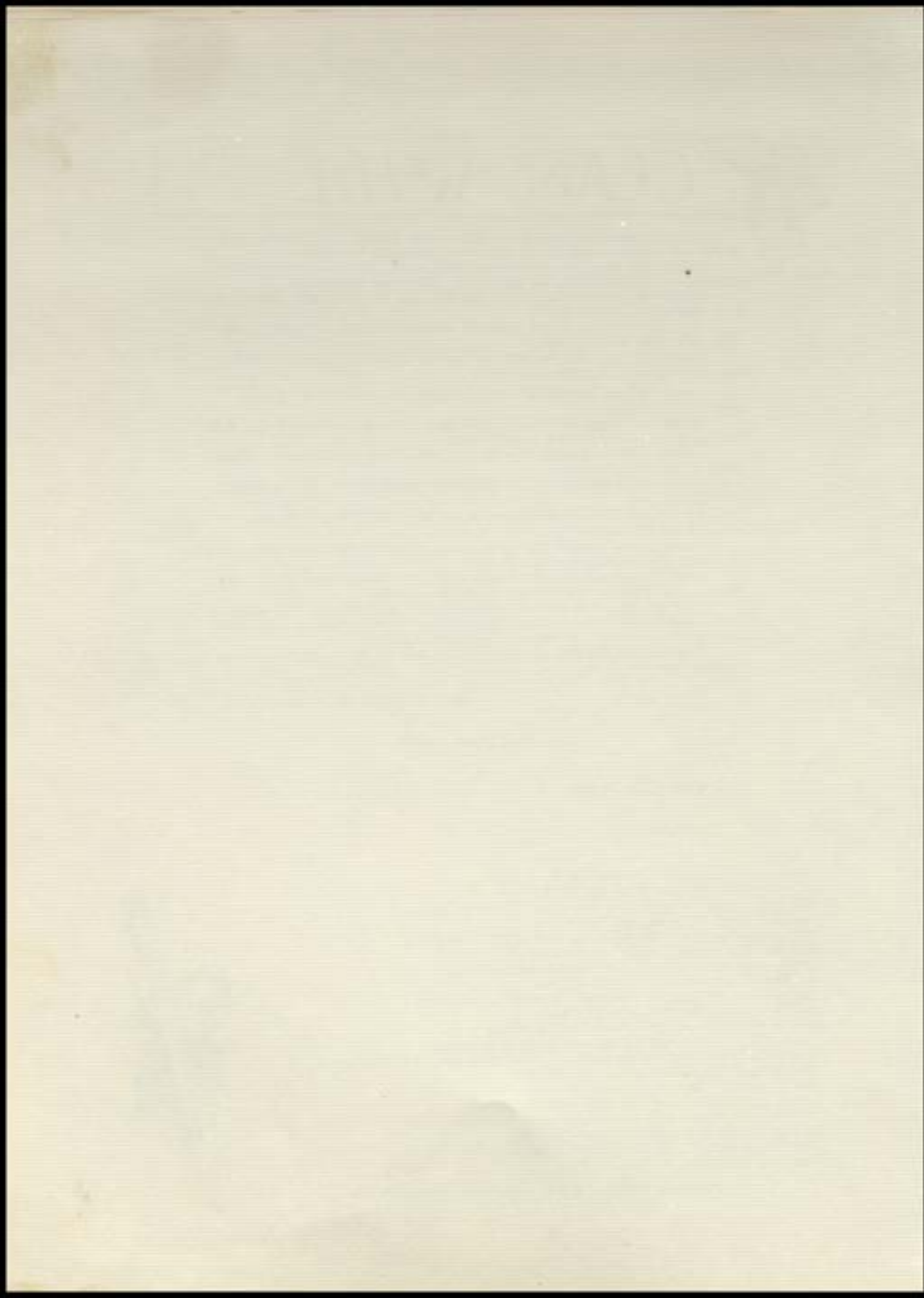
CLASS POEM

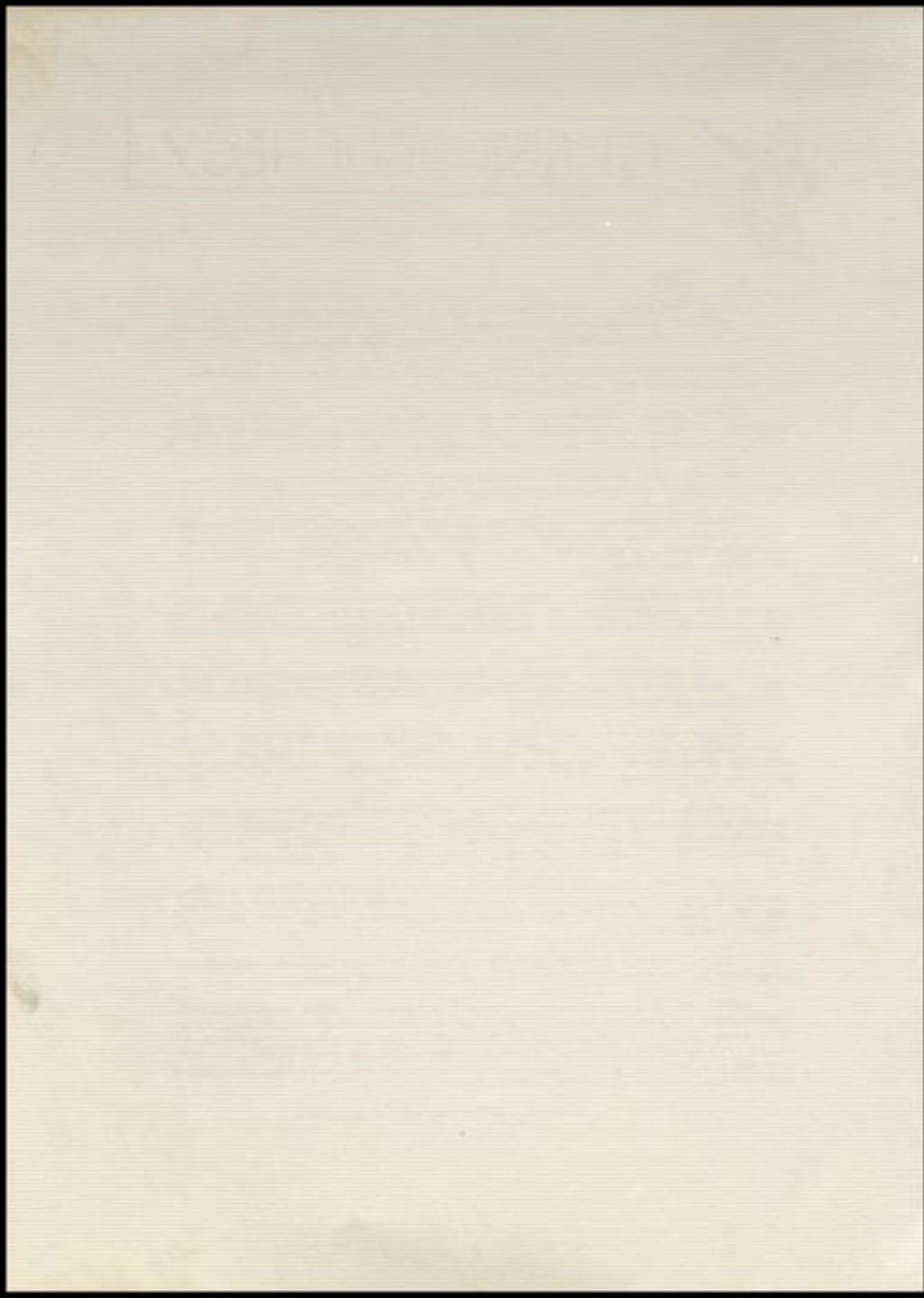

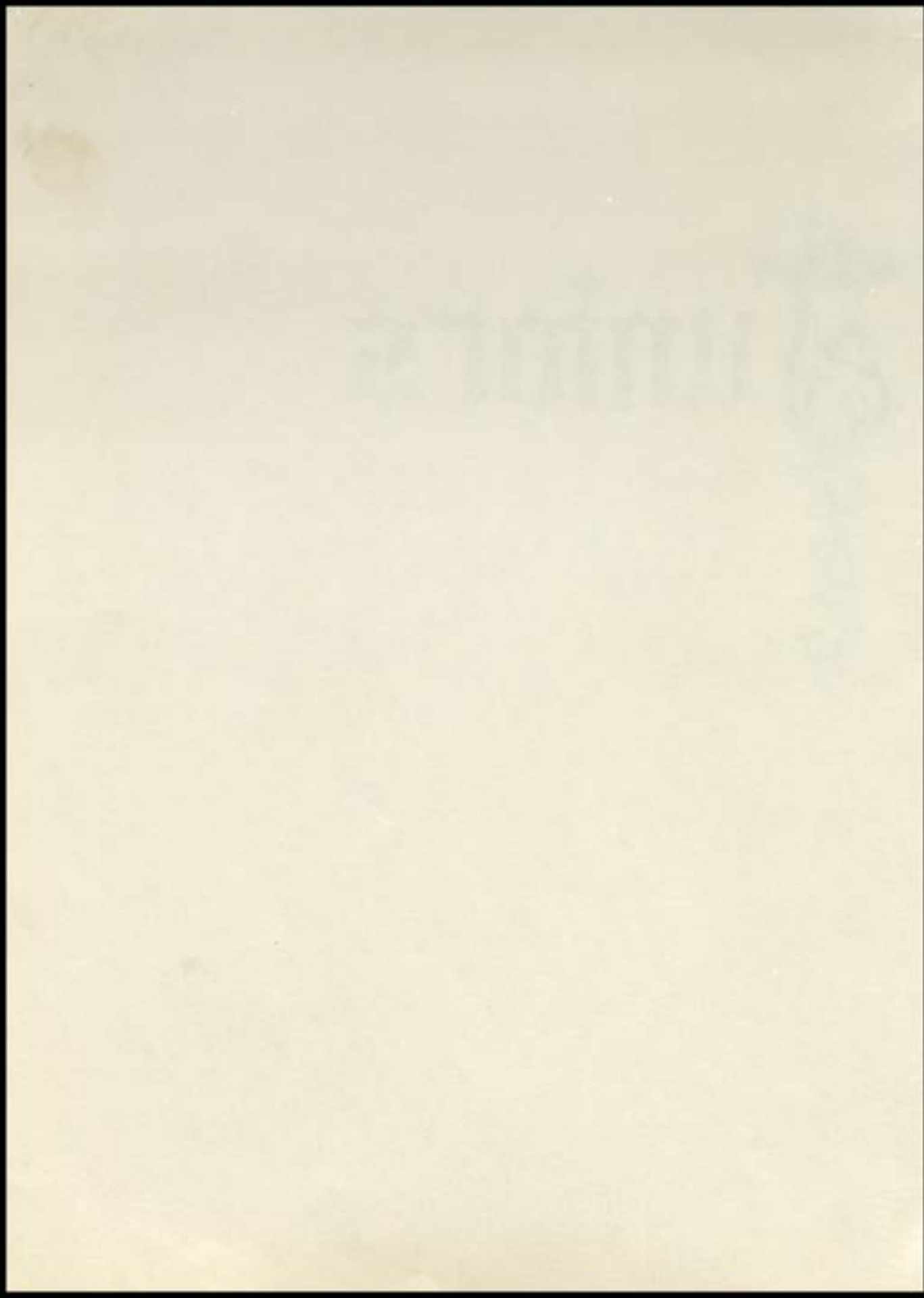
A talk, "Morbid Psychology," by the noted lecturer and anthropologist, Miss Eleanor Tremayne, added length to the interesting program.
