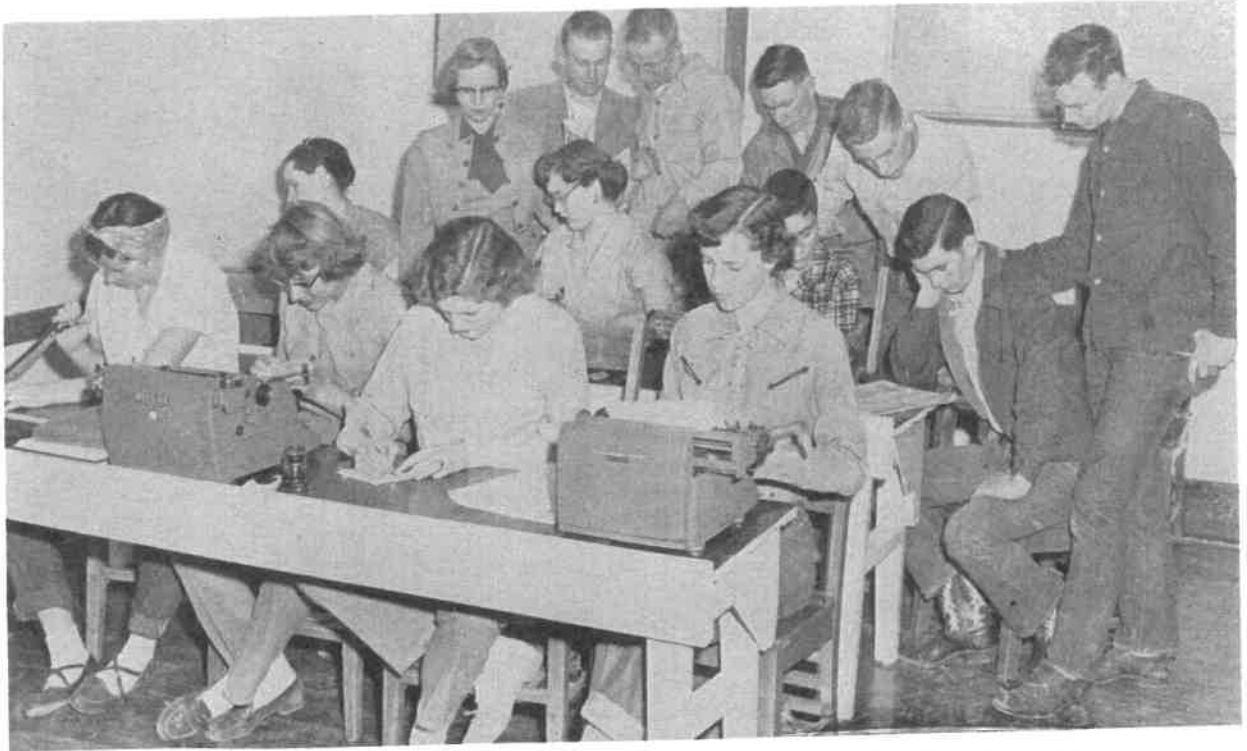

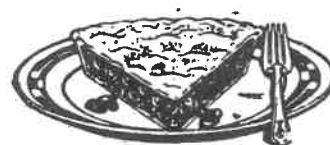

One of the most active organizations in Penrose for the betterment of the school and community is the P. T. A.
